ASSISTANT PROFESSOR IN SPORT PSYCHOLOGY

DEPARTMENT:

The Department of Educational Psychology and Learning Systems invites applications for a tenure-track position within the Department's Sport Psychology program. The Department aims to advance knowledge in the design, development, evaluation, and delivery of effective learning systems and interventions that enhance the intellectual, emotional, social, and physical growth and performance of individuals throughout the life-span and across cultures. Applicants for this position should have a strong program of research and scholarship in sport or exercise psychology. QUALIFICATIONS:

Candidates for this position should have an earned doctorate in sport psychology, related areas of psychology, and/or kinesiology. Stronger candidates will have prior faculty experience in a sport psychology program. Being an Association for Applied Sport Psychology Certified Consultant, and having applied sport psychology supervision experience in the athletic domain are desired. Candidates should demonstrate a strong commitment to research/scholarship, teaching, and should show evidence of experience with or willingness to seek external funding for their program of research.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

The individual hired will be expected to (a) maintain an active research agenda, including the pursuit of appropriate sources of external funding for their work; (b) provide supervision of applied sport psychology practicums; (c) mentor masters and doctoral students in Sport Psychology, and teach related courses; (d) be involved in curriculum development for the program in Sport Psychology; and (e) contribute to department and university growth, as well as the professional community for sport psychology through appropriate service activities.

OTHER INFORMATION:

This is a nine-month, tenure earning position at the assistant professor rank, with possible summer employment. The anticipated start date for this position is August, 2017 (beginning of fall semester 2017). Rank and salary will be commensurate with an individual's experience.
